The 102nd meeting of the Governing Body (GB) of Bhaskaracharya College of Applied Sciences (BCAS) was held on Thursday the 4th July 2024 at 10:30 in hybrid mode. The following members attended the meeting:

Prof. Sidhharth Sirohi, Bursar and Shri Rajiv Kumar Dawar, Section Officer (Accounts), BCAS have attended the meeting as Special Invitee.

At the outset of the meeting, the ex-officio member secretary of the Governing Body, welcomed all the members and sought permission to start the meeting.

He informed the members about the untimely demise of Prof. Shyam Sunder Chibber on October 17, 2023, who was the first OSD of the College from 1995 to 1997 and also informed about the unfortunate demise of Prof. Anil Kumar Bali, Ex-Professor, Department of Zoology, BCAS on December 14, 2023. Prof. Bali rendered his services in the College from 16/08/1997 to 31/01/2023. The house expressed its condolences.

ITEM NO. 102/1 : Report of the Principal of the College

1. The Bhaskaracharya family celebrated its Foundation's day (Convener: Prof. Sidhharth Sirohi) on 5th October 2023. To mark the event, distinguished guests Dr. G. R. Chopra (founder Principal), Prof. Balaram Pani, (Dean of Colleges, DU), Prof. Radhey Shyam Sharma (Chairman, GB, BCAS), Major Sachin Negi (Alumni and Shaurya Chakra Awardee, 2023) graced the occasion along with the staff members, students of BCAS and their proud parents.

2. The college recruited its first batch of 22 cadets in the National Cadet Corp (NCC). Dr. Ramesh Kumar being the Care Taking Officer for these Cadets. Four cadets were the proud recipients of various ranks during the year 2023-24 in the rank ceremony held at NCC Bhawan, Rohini. These proud cadets are as follows:

4. Dr. Anjali Saxena, Assistant Professor, Department of Zoology and Ms. Shivi Naharae, Student, B.Sc(H) Microbiology bagged the prestigious funding for the first round in Hackathon 3.0 under the Incubation Component of MSME Innovative Scheme (Incubation, Design & IPR) of MSME Champion Scheme for Govt. of India.
5. The college in association with the Teaching Learning Centre of Ramanujan College and Deshbandhu College of University of Delhi organized a two-week refresher course in Physics during August 30, 2023 to September 13, 2023 through online mode. Dr. Partha S Pal, Dr. Ramesh Kumar and Dr. Jitender Kumar were the Coordinators of the course.
6. As per the MoU between College and Catholicate College, Kerala, one of the student Pravege P.M performed two weeks internship at BCAS under the exchange program of the said MOU.
7. Dr. Manoj Kumar Tiwari, Assistant Professor Department of Electronic Sciences, has recently been awarded with two patents. First one is a US Patent entitled “Method Using Weighted Aggregated Ensemble Model for Energy Demand Management of Buildings.” Another is an Indian patent on “Overhead Mobile Charging System For Electric Vehicles”.
8. Dr. Yagyadatta Goswami recently has been awarded with two Patents along with his team members. One is an International Design Patent (UK) on a project titled “Portable Cryo-Electron Microscopy” and other one is an Indian Design Patent titled “IoT-Based Ultrasound Diagnostic Machine”.
9. Department of Zoology in association with Environmental Pollution Laboratory (EPL), Department of Environmental Studies, University of Delhi organized a National Workshop on “Raising Awareness on Urban Air quality, Climate Change, Health and e-resilience, sponsored by Department of Science and Technology. About 90 participants participated in the event that was held at BCAS. The Convener was Prof. Sidhharth Sirohi and the team comprising Dr. Anjali Saxena and Dr. Satyam Ravi Dwivedi.
10. The college collaborated with Acharya Narendra Dev College, Phixgen Private Ltd. and other institutes to organize an International Conference of the Indian Network for Soil Contamination on "Exploring the Microbial World: From Human Health to Environmental Sustainability" along with the International Symposium on Ciliate Biology held during April 2-5 2024. The event was organized at the Conference Centre University of Delhi.
11. IQAC organized an International Conference on “Food Systems: A sustainable approach to health, nutrition and environment” in collaboration with Coalition for Food Systems Transformation in India on March 7, 2024. Chairman, Governing Body, Prof. Radhey Shyam, delivered the key note address. A panel discussion on “Rethinking Food Systems: Nutritional security, safety, sustainability, and consumer behaviour” was also organized during the Conference. The panelists of this event were Ms. Nadine Baderre, presenting GIZ Germany, Dr. Aparna Dhawan, The head of Quality and standards in CII, Dr. Rajendra

Dobriyal - Scientific and Regulatory affairs, Coca Cola India and South west Asia, Dr.Shankar Goenka- Managing director of GO Green LLP and Mr. Rijul Bahree-representing Cosmo films.

The panel discussion addressed the use of AI tools in achieving sustainable agriculture, initiatives taken by Coca Cola to follow SDGs including 'Unnathi' which was started from Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, relation of migration and nutritional status, behavioral impacts on sustainability, packaging and sustainability and Food systems transformation having seven labs. The panel also highlighted Linear and Circular Recycling, Community Nutrition Garden, Polylactic Acid Packaging.

12. The college has been conducting personal diet counseling sessions for its staff members from time to time.
13. Prof. Ram Mohan, Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry, Illinois Wesleyan University delivered a lecture on "Better Living through Green Chemistry" on January 8, 2024.
14. The college has organized National Voters Day on January 25, 2024 where the then Hon'ble Union Minister of Commerce & Industry, Consumer Affairs & Food & Public Distribution and Textiles, Govt. of India. Leader of the House in Rajya Sabha Shri Piyush Goyal ji was the Chief Guest along with the Guest of Honour Sh. Ramesh Vidhuri ji, the then Member of Parliament.
15. Ms. Chitra of B.Sc.(H) Computer Science, I year, member of the debate club, has been shortlisted among the top 10 in a Video Essay Competition organized by New Zealand Education for undergraduate students of Indian Educational Institutions on the topic 'Strategies for achieving gender parity in education by 2030 in alignment with SDG4'. She was also a part of the award ceremony held on May 18, 2024 at the New Zealand High Commission in New Delhi.
16. Mr. Akhilesh Kumar, a student of B. Sc.(H) Polymer Science II year has secured 3rd position in a program on lecture in the Climate Change and Net Zero series on Plastics and the sustainability Paradox organized by the Climate Change Research Institute on April 24, 2024 at India International Centre.
17. Ms. Yashawi Sharma, a student of B.Sc. (Hons) Chemistry (Batch of 2020-2023), got the best poster award in the student category in the International Conference entitled, "Crossroads of Chemistry, Biology and Environment Atmosphere: A modern prospective" organized by Department of Chemistry, University of Delhi from 26 to 28 February, 2024.
18. The committee for selection of Best Student Award for the academic year 2023-24 has recommended Mr. Kuntak Saha (Microbiology) and Ms. Shivi (Microbiology) as the best students under the Male and Female categories respectively.

21. The college has renewed its MoUs with SMS Grace Water for Bio-Chemical waste disposal and with M/s Jagruti for paper recycling.
22. The College has registered with Smart Campus Cloud Network to obtain objectives of Sustainable Development Goals and Carbon neutrality in Universities/colleges.
23. The annual cultural fest "Srijan" was celebrated on March 8, 2024 and Sports Day "Spardha" was celebrated on April 3, 2024.
24. Parent Teacher meeting (PTM) was conducted by all the departments during March 26-28 2024 in blended mode.
25. ECO club volunteers of the College participated in Yamuna Ghat cleaning at Chhat Ghat on February 25, 2024.
26. Data sensing instruments were installed in college for the '**UV-radiation Monitoring Program**' for Climate and Health Studies with the support and in collaboration of **Earth and Climate Studies Area, National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC), Hyderabad** and **Department of Space, ISRO, Govt of India**. Dr. Partha S Pal, Associate Professor, Deptt of Physics, BCAS is a Co-Principal Investigator alongwith Dr. S. K. Dhaka from Rajdhani College, University of Delhi. The brief introduction and objective of the project is enclosed as annexure - '1'.
27. First quarter of Grant-in-Aid for FY 2024-25 has been received from Dte. Hr Education (DHE) and the salary along with revised Dearness Allowance (DA) and House Rent Allowance (HRA) with arrear (because of enhanced DA), has been disbursed to all staff members of the College as per the notification received from University of Delhi vide order no. CS.III/Circular/2024/159 dated 20/05/2024.
28. A committee consisting of Joint Proctor, University of Delhi, visited the college on March 12, 2024 regarding periodical visits for the maintenance of health and hygiene in the eatery places and toilets and other items such as installation of security lights etc. The Committee expressed satisfaction over the arrangements.
29. Forty three Solar lights were installed in college under the CSR initiative from HDFC Bank and two Computer/Desktops have been received from M/s. S G Engineers as a donation to the College on July 1st 2024 .

30. The college is making sincere efforts for getting itself registered under CSR and 80G for receiving benefits under schemes/provisions.
31. On 23rd May 2024 college received an email at 2:18 p.m. at its official email account viz. bhaskaracharya.college@bcas.du.ac.in with a subject "Bomb in the University" from rizer111rizer@beeble.com. Taking cognizance of the mail the College had informed Delhi Police SHO, Dwarka, New Delhi and the chowki incharge, Sector-1, Dwarka, New Delhi - 110075. On receipt of the letter the Police Team along with 'Dog squad' and 'Bomb Detection Team' inspected the college premises and informed that everything appeared to be fine and nothing untoward had happened in the College as of now. The College has also informed the incident to the Proctor & the Registrar, University of Delhi.
32. The college has also submitted the NIRF proposal for 2023-24 successfully.
33. The College has gained two positions to reach Rank 67 under the India Today ranking for 2024.

The said re-appointment is for a period of one year w.e.f. 25/02/2024

(ii) Appointment of Teachers Representative in the Governing Body of the College

The members of the GB noted that vide letter No. CS-I/(108)/ TR/BCAS/2024/8361 dated 21/06/2024, the Vice Chancellor, University of Delhi had approved the name of Dr. Sangeeta Srivastava, Professor, Department of Computer Science, BCAS as Teacher's Representative on the Governing Body of the College with effect from 19th July 2024 for a period of one year in place of Dr. Madhulika Bajpai. Dr. Madhulika will be completing her one year term as Teachers Representative on the GB on July 18, 2024.

(iii) Non-teaching Representative on the Governing Body

The member of the GB noted that Ms. Ira Sharma, Section Officer (Administration), is nominated as non-teaching representative on the Governing Body of the college for a period of one year w.e.f. 1st July 2024 in place of Ms. Usha Sati, who has completed her term of one year.

(D) Raising of National Cadet Corps (NCC) Division (01 Platoon-62 Senior Division) Army Wing from Academic year 2023-24:

The members of the GB noted the letter No F.2/7 DBN/NCC/INSTT_SD/11/2023/35 dated 06/11/2023 of Colonel O P Rai, Commanding Officer, 7 Delhi Battalion NCC has informed that:

- 2
 - a) *NCC will commence from the academic year 2023-24.*
 - b) *A strength of volunteer 18 senior cadets will be enrolled in session 2023-24. NCC classes/training will commence after enrolment of cadets.*
 - c) *A suitable and eligible permanent staff member of your school as per eligibility conditions given below, must be identified and sponsored for looking after NCC duties (NCC Caretaker), the documents for appointment of CT is also enclosed for ready reference:*
 - (i) *Male/Female Teacher below 45 years of age. Application/Proformas for appointment of CT is enclosed, request furnish the same and submit at the earliest.*
 - (ii) *Should be permanent staff employed in your school. Staff on contract/temporary basis are not eligible.*
 - (iii) *Should be a volunteer for subsequent appointment as Associate NCC officer (ANO) within a period of 02 years of being appointed Care Taker.*
 - d) *All the conditions mentioned in Para 9 and 11 of the application for raising NCC must be fulfilled by 15 Nov 2023 for e.g.. Allotment of a separate store room, office for NCC ANO/CT detailment of a civilian peon /staff to assist in the running of NCC in the College.*

3. *It will be our endeavor to ensure a smooth and organized raising of NCC, in your Institute, in close cooperation and involvement of the Principal/Head of Institution. The responsibility of proper and efficient running of NCC is of the Principal/NCC Caretaker with regular guidance and support from our staff, at all times. Personal involvement and monitoring of NCC activities by the Principal/Head of Institution goes a long way in achieving a good standard by the NCC Cadets of your college, it is requested to ensure close liaison and regular touch with our staff, to ensure the smooth functioning of NCC.*

The members also noted that Dr. Ramesh Kumar, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics, is appointed to look after the NCC duties in the College.

The members also ratified the grant of duty leave to Dr Ramesh Kumar from 29th July to 11th October 2024 or till the date of joining the duties, whichever is earlier, to join the training programme at PRCN/Refresher being conducted by NCC at OTA Kamptee, Maharashtra.

Permission is accorded to provide financial assistance to the CTO from the college, if required.

(E) Promotion of teaching staff**(i) Promotion of Assistant Professor as Associate Professors under Career Advancement Scheme Regulations-2018 (CAS 2018).**

The members of the GB ratified the decision of approving the recommendations of the Selection Committee meetings held on 30th October 2023, promoting the following Assistant Professors, as Associate Professor, Academic Level 13A, (Rs.1,31,400/- to 2,17,100; (Pay Band Rs. 37,400-67,000 AGP Rs. 9,000/- as per 6th CPC)) under Career Advancement Scheme Regulations-2018.

(iii) **Promotion of Dr. Manoj Kumar Tiwari, Assistant Professor in Department of Electronic Science.**

- e. The nature of his services during deputation were purely non-academic and administrative. It was, therefore, requested to the University of Delhi to clarify whether the period of his services at AICTE, in the assessment period or the entire period of deputation may be considered or not, for the promotion under CAS-2018?
- f. University of Delhi vide letter no. CS-I/(111)/Clari/BCAS/2024/7922 Dated 07-05-2024, has clarified that “administrative experience can not be considered for promotion of teachers”.
- g. In view of the above, the date of his promotion to the academic level 12 has to be revised by 68 days after he resumed his duties w.e.f. 03-08-2021.
- h. Accordingly, his date of promotion for academic level 12 to be revised by 68 days as 09-10-2021 instead of 22-01-2016.

(Q) Contract for providing Canteen Services in the College through GeM portal.

(i) Tender for providing canteen services in the College was uploaded on the GeM portal vide tender No. GeM/2023/B/4331321 date 12-12-2023, the financial bids of all 12 vendors were opened on 30th January 2024. The committee, while analyzing the financial comparative, generated on GeM portal, found wide variation in total price (from 0.01 to 5,59,640.00). The committee sought clarification from the selected L1 bidder telephonically but was not convinced; vendor L2 was also contacted to clarify his bid but still the committee was not convinced for a common logic for all.

Hence, the committee recommended to cancel the above tender (tender dated 12-12-2023) and the tender was re-floated through GeM. The ongoing contract of M/s. Deepali Caterers, was extended for a further period to provide the canteen services on existing terms and conditions in the college, till the finalization of new tender.

(ii) Tender for providing the canteen services in the College was uploaded afresh on GeM portal vide tender No. GEM/2024/B/4841219 dated 5th April 2024. 31 bids were received in response to the above tender. The technical bids were opened on 3rd May 2024. 20 bids were technically disqualified. The eligible 11 financial bids were opened on 30-05-2024. After the comparative chart generated by GeM., M/s. Kritika Hospitality, being the L1 vendor was selected as the successful vendor. On the recommendation of the committee order for providing canteen services in the college was placed to M/s. Kritika Hospitality, 21-A, B2C Block, Janak Puri, New Delhi Delhi -110058, vide order dated 13-06-2024 for the period of three years, on 1+1+1 basis as per the tender terms and conditions. . He has started operating the Canteen Services w.e.f. 20th June 2024.

(R) Request for CSR Funding for Education, Skill Development for Green Hydrogen through technology based initiatives titled “Green Horizon: A Journey in Education, Skill Development for Green Hydrogen, Environment and Sustainable Energy”.

Bhaskaracharya College of Applied Sciences (BCAS) is willing to initiate a project in green hydrogen-generated power in collaboration with industry partners. This project aligns with sustainable development goals, aiming to minimize the carbon footprint and foster energy independence. The key Objectives of the proposal are placed as annexure- '3'

This initiative will be integral to University curriculum, covering renewable energy, system optimization, and safety management, preparing students for careers in instrumentation, green

hydrogen, and renewable energy sectors. This initiative offers extensive benefits for the college, its students, local communities, policymakers, and the broader academic and technological communities.

The project underscores BCAS's commitment to sustainable energy and practical education, positioning the college as a leader in clean energy education and marking a significant step towards making BCAS probably the first college in the country to achieve self-reliance in energy needs. This endeavour will also contribute to technological innovation and skill development, vital for the future.

The proposal needs to be carried with the help of CSR funding by an industry.

Proposal submitted to the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas is for Rs. 53.25 Cr. We believe this project is in perfect harmony with the government's vision of Viksit Bharat for a clean, prosperous, and self-reliant India. Due norms will be followed while executing the project.

(S) Complaint against Website vendor M/s Maxtra Technologies

The college had filed a Complaint against M/s. Maxtra Technologies Pvt. Ltd., having its office at B-71, Aristos Tower, 2nd Floor, Sector-67 Noida, UP-201301, India, Tel: 0120-421002; (www.maxtratechnologies.com) with known Regd office at House No. 88, Village Ghyan, P.O. Chail Chowk, Tehsil Chail Chowk, Gohar, H.P.-175045, through Mr. Shivendra Dwivedi (Founder and Director) and its V.P. Shri Tushar (Mobile No. 8744075752, 8595547718) for the breach of tender terms and conditions. The said complaint is submitted as annexure -4. Presently, the vendor has restored the website only upto January 2021 and is available temporarily at bcas1.du.ac.in.

The college has initiated the development of a new website at the previous domain bcas.du.ac.in with the help from the students of the Computer Science department.

(T) Tender for providing sanitation & stationery items in the college:

- (i) Tender for supplying housekeeping items in the College : For supplying housekeeping/sanitation items in the college, tender on GeM (via BOQ mode) was floated vide ref. no. GEM/2023/B/4109690 dated 19/10/2023. After technical evaluation of bid on 31/10/2023, 05 bids received were technically qualified for their financial bid opening. As per the comparative chart provided by GeM, M/s. V.G. Enterprises had quoted the lowest rate of Rs. 4,14,375/- (Rs. Four Lakh fourteen Thousand Three Hundred and Seventy Five Only) (@Rs. 82,875/- per lot) for five lots/ times for supply of the housekeeping items in the college. The vendor supplied the first lot partially only after a lot of repetitive reminders. He was not responding to our mails or messages. Keeping hygiene conditions in an educational institute of repute is the foremost responsibility and several sanitation items are needed regularly but we were unable to process the same as the successful vendor was not responding. The committee recommends to cancel the order place to M/s V G Enterprises and the vendor be blacklisted to work in the college.

After meetings and discussions the L2 vendor M/s Survive Pharma has given his consent to provide the items on rates given by L1. Hence, the order for providing housekeeping items in the college was placed to M/s. Survive Pharma (L2 bidder) at the rates given by L1 vendor as per the GFR 2017 rule 173 (XVI).

(ii) Tender for supplying stationery items in the College : For supplying the stationery items in the college, tender on GeM (via BOQ mode) was placed vide order No.GEM/2023/B/4110239 dated 19/10/2023. A total 08 bids were received and all found technically qualified. On 31/10/2023 financial bids were opened. As provided by the GeM , the L1 vendor i.e. M/s. Kartik Enterprises had quoted the lowest rate of Rs. 1,62,500/- (Rs. One Lakh Sixty Two Thousand Five Hundred Only) for all items (@ Rs. 32,500/ per lot) for five lots/times. The order was placed to M/s. Kartik Enterprises accordingly.

It was also approved that for the benefit of the student's and for the smooth conduct of classes in the odd semester, she may proceed on Sabbatical Leave from January 1, 2025 or the date of commencement of the even semester 2024-25, whichever is earlier. During the Sabbatical leave Dr. Sangeeta will be governed by the rules applicable in this regard.

The GB members noted that the approved budget will be forwarded to the Directorate of Higher Education, as per procedure, for release of Grant-in-aid/funds for the financial year 2024-25. The budget heads above may be changed or defined as per the DHE format, if required.

(F) BCAS Students Fund utilization for capital asset:-

The members of the GB noted the following:

I Vide letter No. CB-II/Circular No. 13/Audit/2019/595 dated 14/12/2020 issued by Assistant Registrar (Colleges), University of Delhi regarding guidelines of use of Student's Fund. The GB noted the following guidelines for use of Student's Society Fund:

- i. These funds (College Development Fund, Hostel Funds, Students Society Fund, Admission Processing Charges etc) can be used for the purpose for which they are collected and may also be used for the purpose of development of infrastructure including Laboratories, Library, ICT Facilities etc.
- ii. Any unspent amount will be carried forward for the future needs of the College
- iii. The Governing Body will be the competent authority to sanction the budget out of these funds in accordance with norms of University of Delhi.
- iv. Strict adherence to GFR notified by the Government of India from time to time shall be made while making expenditure out of these funds.
- v. The books of account shall be audited each year by an auditor out of the panel of auditors approved by the Governing Body.
- vi. The Audited books of accounts shall be approved by the Governing Bodies.
- vii. A copy of the approved balance sheet shall be submitted to the University of Delhi.

II Vide letter No. CB.II/GIA-DG Colleges/2021/521 dated 15.03.2021 of Joint Registrar (Colleges) University of Delhi issued the clarification regarding guidelines for use of Students Society Fund stating that '*The corpus of Student Society Fund created over number of years is required to be utilized by the Governing Body of the said colleges for their holistic development in line with the Executive Council Resolution/guidelines issued by this University*'.

III While granting the NAAC 'A++' grade, the NAAC peer team observed and recommended improving the infrastructure of the college to enhance the academic environment. It is noted that for many years the college has not received any Grant-In-Aid from the DHE for the purchase of IT items, furniture, laboratory equipment, and books as per NEP guidelines.

After deliberating the above letters and recommendations of the NAAC peer team, the members of the Governing Body approved the utilization of the Rs. 1.65Crores (Rs One Crore Sixty Five Lakhs Only) of funds available in the Students Fund Account for the purchase of essential items for the smooth conduct of classes, laboratory experiments, and to improve the provision of basic infrastructure for students, following the GFR norms, as proposed below:

- 1) Rs. 0.05CR for library books to cater to the UGCF curriculum.
- 2) Rs. 0.60CR for capital assets in the laboratories.
- 3) Rs. 0.90CR for IT items to be explored to procure directly from the manufacturer.
- 4) Rs. 0.10CR for Furniture items

The Principal was authorized to re-appropriate the Departmental budget, if required, keeping the total expenses under the sanctioned amount of Rs. 1.65CR only.

(G) Migration Policy of the college.

The University of Delhi has allowed the students of II year to apply for inter college migration, while fulfilling the requisite criteria/ guidelines from time to time. In this context, the College proposed the following guidelines for dealing with such cases.

I. *Migration from other colleges:-*

- i. The college would display the vacant seats to seek application based on total no of sanctioned seats in a program only.
- ii. The admission will be based on the merit in their 1st year Term End Examination (TEE) (descending order) and as per norms of the University of Delhi.
- iii. The interested students should submit a NOC from the parent institution at the time of submitting the application.
- iv. The college admission committee would process such applications.
- v. Class roll no would be issued once college fee is deposited by the student.

II. *Migration to other colleges:-*

- i. To avoid any audit objection, the college can't afford to increase the number of vacant seats in a program.
- ii. The bonafied student of the college would be the one, who deposited college fee for the respective academic year.
- iii. Students would be permitted migration from a program only if number of students in a class is above the sanctioned strength + 10% (of sanctioned strength) only.
- iv. The number of such students (iii above) will be given an NOC on first cum and first serve basis for each program.
- v. A merit list will be prepared based on the I year TEE result (ascending order) among all the students who would have applied for migration.
- vi. In case of simultaneous application by two or more students, the students will be given NOC as per merit list prepared.
- vii. The migrated student to other college would be eligible for refundable security deposit only.
- viii. TICs would forward request to the admission committee to process such cases, if any.

After due deliberations and discussions, the house approve the above policy regarding migration of students. The policy would be effective from the academic year 2024-25. It was emphasized that awareness should be spread about the policy amongst the students.

(H) Identification of Course wise Slow and Fast learners

The college needs to have a well-documented mechanism to identify course specific slow and fast learners by respective teachers, which is required for various accreditation purposes and also mentioned by the NAAC Peer team during their visit in June 2023. The following has been decided for the same.

- I. The college would include Home Examination as part of its academic calendar. Students would be made aware of the time period of conduct of these examinations as decided by the college. The home examination would be held in mid of each semester with 40-60% of the syllabus as per the respective lesson plan submitted. Department may design their mechanism, if so desired. All the students would be required to give these home examination mandatorily. The marks scored will be one of the components of their Internal Assessment and would be displayed widely in a time bound manner. No repeat chances for this component would be permissible for students. Also, students failing to appear will be assigned a zero for the respective component in the corresponding course/ paper.
- II. A 60% weightage of the marks scored in the above Home Examination will be one of the indicators for identification of the slow and fast learners. 40% marks would be awarded by the concerned teacher(s) based on their own assessment in the class (other than the attendance). The merit list so prepared for identification of slow and fast learners will be submitted to the TIC and not to be displayed anywhere. TIC would submit the consolidated award list to the IQAC.
- III. The merit thus prepared in 'b' above would be the basis for a particular course. The benchmark would be 60%.
- IV. Slow learners for a particular course would be facilitated by the respective teacher
 - Personal attention
 - Remedial classes in the time table
 - Assignments and study material
 - Question bank
 - Any other activity identified by the teacher(s)
- V. Fast learners for a particular course would be facilitated by the respective teacher
 - Advanced Assignments
 - Participation in research or other initiatives
 - Participation in seminars/ conferences/ industry internship
 - Self study Online course content
 - Any other activity identified by the teacher(s)
- VI. Each faculty should prepare report after final result declaration showing the performance of slow learners to close the loop.

ITEM NO. 102/6: ANY OTHER ITEMS WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE CHAIR.

(A) Proposal for work /projects to be carried out by the Public Works Department Civil & Electrical (PWD, (Civil) & (Electrical)) in the College.

The GB accorded its approval for the below mentioned proposals to be forwarded or resubmitted to DHE/ PWD for immediate action.

(i) Proposal for the supply, installation, testing, and commissioning of a replacement fire-fighting system at BCAS to be carried out by the PWD (Electrical): The vide letter No. BCAS/4(3)/DHE/2013/1072 dated 29/09/2023 College has submitted the proposal for a capital work project namely the supply, installation, testing, and commissioning of a replacement fire-fighting system at BCAS, amounting to Rs. 30,50,261/-, for administrative approval and expenditure sanction for the Directorate of Hr Education , GNCTD. However, in the last financial year i.e. 2023-24, the College has not received the approval of the DHE for the carrying out the aforesaid work. Given that fire safety measures are essential and mandatory for all government buildings, particularly educational institutions, the replacement of our condemned fire system is of utmost importance to prevent any untoward incidents

In light of above, the College vide letter No. BCAS/2024/DHE/(3)/573 dated 14/06/2024 has again submitted the proposal for grant of the necessary approval and expenditure sanction for the supply, installation, testing, and commissioning of the replacement fire-fighting system, amounting to Rs. 30,50,261/- (Rupees Thirty Lakhs Fifty Thousand Two Hundred and Sixty One Only), by the PWD (Electrical) in the current financial year on an urgent basis.

(ii) Proposal for construction of portable cabin for class rooms: With the introduction of New Education Policy (NEP), there is an urgent requirement of more classrooms/lecture rooms in the College. A proposal for expansion of building including construction of classrooms is in process and taking time. Therefore, for the benefits of the student's fraternity and for the smooth conduct of classes, it is proposed that 8 numbers of porta cabins for classrooms may be constructed by the Public Works Department (PWD) Civil & Electrical.

(iii) Repair of boundary wall : In the year 2022 repair of part of the boundary wall was carried out by the PWD. It has been noticed that some other area of the boundary wall has now started tilting (around 200 to 400 mtrs.) apart from the area repaired earlier which requires immediate repair. In view of the above, to avoid any further damage to the boundary wall and for the security of the College, it is requested approval may be accorded for repair of the boundary wall of the College on priority basis by the PWD (Civil).

(iv) Repair/replacement of main gate with main gate made up of steel : In October 2021 one side to the main gate had fallen off and was repaired. It has been noticed that otherside of the main gate needs to be repaired on an urgent basis. The main gate is made up of iron and in a few places the condition is deteriorating and needs to be repaired as it is nearly 25 to

27 yrs old. This has not only affected the appearance of the entrances of the College but has also started weakening the pillars holding it.

In view of the above, it is proposed to replace the present Iron Gate with stainless steel gate as it is known for its durability, resistance to rust and low maintenance requirements. The replacement of the gate will ensure the security of the students/visitors of the college but also enhance the visual appeal of the entrance of the College.

- (v) Misc. Civil Work: Provision of Channel Gates at different entrances on the Ground floor of the building, repair of outlet of water pipeline, replacement & installation of college sign board of College at key locations in Dwarka.
- (vi) Maintenance of the AV room which needs all the air conditioners to be replaced along with interiors and PA system.
- (vii) Replacement of air conditioner in the Principal Block, Admin, accounts, Conference room, computer labs.
- (viii) The annual maintenance of the electrical equipments like a.c., water cooler, RO, generator, high rise lights and other electrical and civil work etc.

(B) Proposal for MoU with State Bank of India for the Educational Loan to the College student.

A proposal has been received from the State Bank of India for the aforesaid MoU to provide educational loan to the students of BCAS. After due discussion and deliberation the house accorded its proposal for the same in the interest of the students. It would be publicized appropriately.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to all present members.

Principal's Report

Point 26 : 'UV-radiation Monitoring Program' for Climate and Health Studies with the support and in collaboration of Earth and Climate Studies Area, National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC), Hyderabad and Department of Space, ISRO, Govt of India.

Brief Introduction and objective of the project:

The sun emits energy over a broad spectrum of wavelengths. Fortunately for life on Earth, our atmosphere's stratospheric ozone layer shields us from most UV radiation. Surface reaching UV radiation affects human health both positively and negatively. According to the degree of damage, UV radiation is divided into three bands: UV-A (320 - 400 nm), UV-B (280 - 320 nm), and UV-C (100 - 280 nm). UV-A is the least energetic and may cause suntan, whereas UV-C is the most powerful, which can cause mutations and even death with a small amount of exposure. The damage caused by UV-B is somewhere in between. As sunlight passes through the atmosphere, all UV-C and approximately 90% of UV-B radiation are absorbed by ozone, water vapor, oxygen and carbon dioxide. UV-A radiation is less affected by the atmosphere. Therefore, the UV radiation reaching the Earth's surface is largely composed of UV-A with a small UV-B component.

Short exposure to UV-B radiation generates vitamin D, but prolonged human exposure to solar UV radiation may cause erythema (reddening of the skin). Specific concerns include increases in the incidence of skin cancer, ocular damage, Vitamin deficiency related issues, and other health effects in humans and animals; damage to terrestrial and oceanic vegetation; changes in the chemistry of the lower atmosphere (the troposphere), e.g., photochemical smog formation; and alterations of the biogeochemical cycles. UV radiation also has an effect on climate change, atmospheric chemical processes and ecosystem balance. On a global level, quality controlled surfaces reaching UV data are archived at the World Meteorological Organization operated by Environment Canada.

But such data over India is not available. This limitation can be overcome or lessened by means of ground-based and space-borne remote sensing.

Objective:

1. The primary goal of this program is to monitor surface reaching UV-A and UV-B.
More specifically, the objectives of this program are as follows:
Establish UV (i.e., UV-A & B) climatology based on long-term monitoring,
Validate satellite derived UV irradiance at Earth's surface,
2. Detect temporal (e.g. diurnal and seasonal) patterns in surface reaching UV irradiance.



6. **Innovation Hub for Renewable Energy and Instrumentation:** The college is setting up a state-of-the-art innovation hub or research center on campus to spur advancements in renewable energy and instrumentation, nurturing a culture of student-led research and development and self sustenance.
7. **Minimizing Annual Power Expenditure to Insignificant Levels:** By generating its own power and adopting energy-efficient practices, BCAS aims to substantially lower its annual power costs to near negligible, redirecting these savings towards further educational and infrastructural enhancements.
8. **Promoting Environmental Conservation Awareness:** The college is also dedicated to raising awareness and education about environmental consciousness and conservation both within the campus and in the broader community.

ITEM NO.102/4 (S): Complaint against Website vendor M/s Maxtra Technologies

The college had filed a Complaint against M/s. Maxtra Technologies Pvt. Ltd., having its office at B-71, Aristos Tower, 2nd Floor, Sector-67 Noida, UP-201301, India, Tel: 0120-421002; (www.maxtratechnologies.com) with known Regd office at House No. 88, Village Ghyan, P.O. Chail Chowk, Tehsil Chail Chowk, Gohar, H.P.-175045, through Mr. Shivendra Dwivedi (Founder and Director) and its V.P. Shri Tushar (Mobile No. 8744075752, 8595547718) for the breach of tender terms and conditions.

That the above named company i.e. M/s. Maxtra Technologies Pvt. Ltd. was allotted contract for re-designing, development hosting and annual maintenance of the college website vide order No.BCAS/10(6)/2019/279 dated 01.10.2019 for a period of two years as the above said company had quoted lowest amount in the tender floated by the college and accordingly contract was duly awarded to them as per the published and settled terms and conditions of the contract executed between the college and the above said company.

M/s Maxtra Technologies Pvt. Ltd. accepted our contract on terms and conditions mentioned in our tender document vide letter dated 26.09.2019; college diary no. 1870 dated 26.09.2019.

As per the terms and conditions of the tender document, the first part of the contract for redesign, development, hosting and annual maintenance of the college website expired on 31.08.2022 and dues were cleared. Meanwhile, the college staff was looking after the website work required for the NAAC or otherwise.

Based on experience, the website committee recommended that annual maintenance of college website be awarded to M/s Maxtra Technologies Pvt. Ltd. for 1 year with effect from 01.09.2022. As per the terms and conditions of the tender, the contract was awarded to M/s Maxtra Technologies Pvt. Ltd. for 1 year retrospectively with effect from 01.09.2022 vide reference number BCAS/10 (6)/2022/1396 dated 16.11.2022.

However, M/s Maxtra Technologies Pvt. Ltd. vide mail dated 12.01.2023 refused to accept the annual maintenance of the college website at the price quoted by them in the tender (Rs. 5000/- per annum). This is in complete violation of the agreed terms and conditions of the tender document where the vendor is bound to provide the services, if offered. The vendor, however, is blackmailing us for more than the quoted price to continue the services (mail dated January 12 2023).

The website of the college was not working properly since August 2023 and it was showing a blank white screen internally as well as in the public domain which was causing great hardship to the college as General Public could not access the website of the college in the public domain and moreover, even the college officials were unable to do any activities due to the non-working of the website as no public notice as well as other notices for the student and staff could not be uploaded on the website nor the same was accessible to the college staff as well as to the general public and moreover during the admission days the college has faced great hardship in the admission of the new student as they have to create

link for the admission purpose on the main website of the Delhi University, so that student can fill form and seek admission in the college in Mop-up round.

That the college and its members / staff had made various requests to the officials of the above said company telephonically, personally as well as through various mails and even the staff of the college had met personally with the VP Shri Tushar with regard to the difficulty being faced by the college due to non-functioning of the college website which was duly created and maintained by the above said company and moreover all the personal / official data of all the staff members were in the custody of the above said company which can be misused by them by selling into the black web as well as the Cyber Crime Scamester.

That the undersigned as well as other staff members of the college requested to the staff of the above said company and even approach the owner of the company with regard to the grievance of the college due to non-functioning of the college website but no heed was paid by anyone on behalf of the above said company and even the data available with the above said company was not handed over to the college (as per tender terms and conditions) despite repeated requests and approaches being made by the college as the same is being confidential and private in nature and the same can be misused by the above said company which can cause great harm to the reputation of the college as well as personal details of the staff / students of the college can also be misused by the above said company for their own benefit or for the benefit of some unsocial elements / Scamester.

That the college also came to know that the above said company after being awarded contract for the redesigning of the website of the college was also allotted contract by two other college of the Delhi University and almost same design of website of those colleges was also designed by the above said company, although the same were changed later on, on the objection on behalf of the college and accordingly the above said company was having bad intentions and flouted the terms of the contract.

That since the website of the college is not operating / functional since August 2023 and no heed is being paid by the above said company to the various complaints / requests being made by the college for the non-functional of the website and neither the data available with the company is being provided to the college and accordingly the college apprehend that the same might be misused by the above said company which will be very harmful for the reputation of the college and further the personal information of the staff as well as student of the college will be leaked by the above said company which will have lot of repercussion to the students of the staff of the college and further more the college is facing lot of inconvenience due to the non-operation of the website which is hampering day to day activity of the college.

That the college apprehends that the intention of the above said company and its officials as well as the director have turned malafide by not maintaining the website of the college as well as not transferring the relevant data available with them to the college as the same can be misused by them which can be fatal for the college as well as staff and student and moreover, the college apprehend that some cyber crime might be committed by the above said company due to the data available with them.

The college thus filed a complaint to investigate the same as early as possible and necessary FIR be registered against the above said company and its officials for their illegal acts as well as for cyber-crime as detailed mentioned herein above under the relevant provision of Indian Penal Code as well as Information Technology Act 2021. Further actions need to be taken to retrieve the college data from the company along with the domain of the college website as it existed in the original form before the website was destroyed /tampered /sabotaged. In case any of the options do not materialise /work out / no breakthrough is made in resolving the website issue, then performance security amount of Rs. 25,000/- may be forfeited in violation of tender terms and conditions.

Presently, the vendor has restored the website only upto January 2021 and is available temporarily at bcas1.du.ac.in. The college has initiated the development of a new website at the previous domain bcas.du.ac.in with the help from the students of the Computer Science department.
